RE: Proposal to Conduct Survey Research on the Potential Cannabis Policy

Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz & Associates (FM3 Research or FM3) is pleased to present this proposal to conduct survey research to assess local opinions on the City of Redondo Beach's potential policies and regulations on cannabis businesses. We believe our firm is an excellent choice to provide these services for several reasons, including our up-to-date familiarity with voter sentiment in Redondo Beach from assessing the viability of the ultimately successful Measure FP in 2024 and our extensive experience testing community opinions on city cannabis policies throughout California.

FM3 is a nationally recognized leader in conducting research to reform state and local laws regulating the production, sale, and adult use of cannabis products. In 2016, our work helped shape what would ultimately become California's Proposition 64, the Adult Use Marijuana Act. Since the passage of Proposition 64, we have provided research gauging resident and voter attitudes on local policies toward cannabis regulation and taxation for 30+ California communities, working with city and county governments to ensure fair and balanced assessments of potential cannabis revenue measures. Our research assesses the viability of potential measures and, where viable, provides a legally permissible educational roadmap on how to inform the public about the potential measures. FM3's clients whose electorates have voted to pass cannabis tax/regulation measures in California include the cities of Bellflower, Costa Mesa, Culver City, Daly City, El Monte, El Segundo, Hemet, Hermosa Beach, La Habra, Long Beach, Merced, Montclair, Palm Springs, Pomona, Sacramento, San Jose, Santa Ana, San Luis Obispo, Santa Paula, Seaside, South Lake Tahoe, Tulare, Visalia, and West Hollywood, as well as Calaveras County, Humboldt County, and unincorporated Los Angeles County.

For this project, we recommend surveying a sample of registered voters in Redondo Beach. This will provide data on residents who tend to be somewhat more politically engaged than residents who are not registered to vote, and is a more cost-efficient option than surveying a sample of all adult residents ages 18 and over. A resident sample could be deemed more inclusive of the entire community citywide, so we have also included costs for a resident survey for your consideration.

FM3's recommended research specifications and associated costs follow below.
