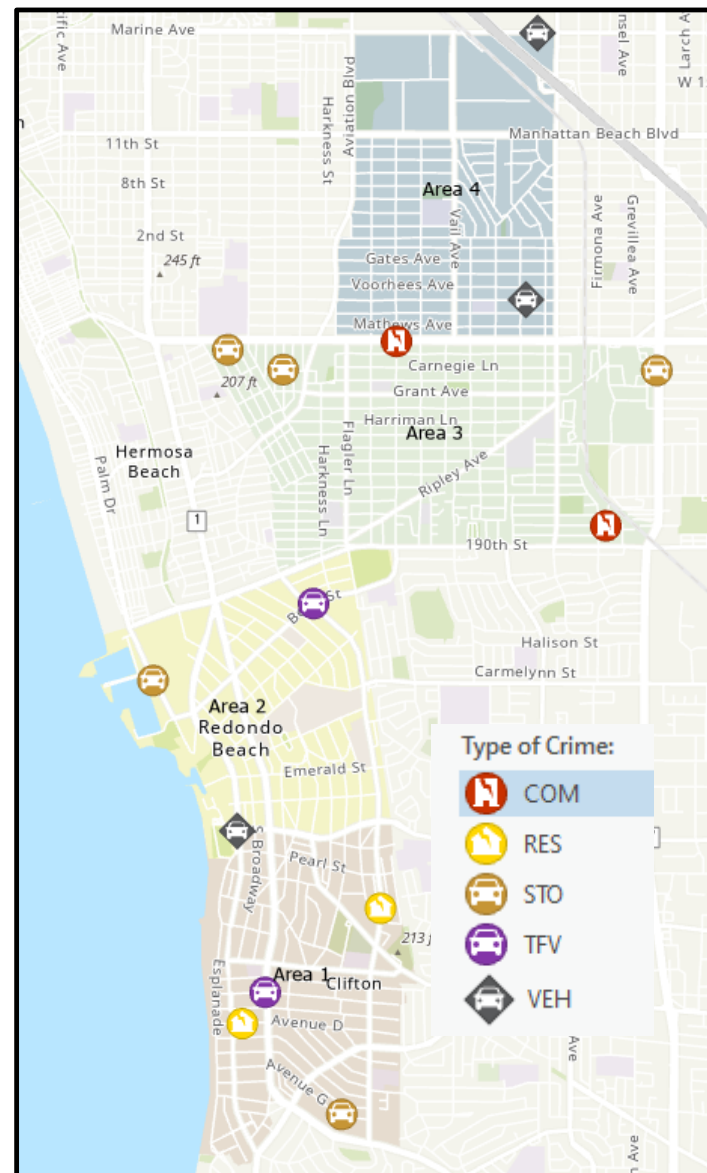

DETAILS: On WED, 18 AUG 21 1530-1531 Hrs, the above-pictured susps entered the victim's locked '89 Toyota Camry via the front D/S door by unk means, while it was parked on the first floor, Row F in the parking garage located on the S/S of Carson west of MACY'S, and removed multiple items ~~including~~ USB phone charger - \$20 // sunshade - \$5 // maintenance spray log book - \$5 // jumper cables and misc items in the trunk - \$20 // Yel DEWALT corded reciprocating saw taken from the trunk - \$150, 210031003.

SUSP DESC: S1 WHMA, 35-45 yrs, wearing a Blk hat, sunglasses, light-colored L/S shirt, Blk jeans, White/Blk tennis shoes, carrying a Blk satchel on the front of his body along with a Blk crawling backpack // S2 WHFA, 35-45 yrs, Blk hair worn pulled back and up, wearing a Blk sweatshirt/jacket, L1 Blu jeans, L1 Blu messenger bag, flip flops, Y/M hoop earrings, Y/M bracelets on left wrist, watch on right wrist, small tattoo on right ring finger - security officers recognized the female as someone they had contacted in the parking lot at ~1630 Hrs as possibly intoxicated (personal info was not obtained) - left victim's car smelling like cigarette smoke

RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION SITE CRIMES

DETAILS: In less than two months, there have been seven incidents involving thefts from and burglars to residential construction sites predominantly in South Torrance. In one of those incidents, a s-veh was captured on video (see below for description and images).

The crimes are occurring between 0400 and 0500 Hrs, weekends and week days. Tools are most commonly targeted, but appliances have also been taken.

MISSING PERSON

DETAILS: On WED, 25 AUG 21, the R/P reported her son HIGGINS, Kwaumain as missing. HIGGINS has been homeless since an unk date last year and is known to frequent the STARBUCKS, 21209 Hawthorne - the employees there often called the R/P when HIGGINS came into the cafe, 210031851.

The R/P has not heard from HIGGINS since FEB '21 and advised HIGGINS no longer has a phone and he has stopped posting videos and pictures on his *INSTAGRAM* account (KIAMIZZLE). Prior to HIGGINS' 2020 breakup with his girlfriend, his behavior became strange, which the R/P believed was the result of methamphetamine use.

Prior the R/P, HIGGINS has no physical or mental impairment and is capable of taking care of himself.

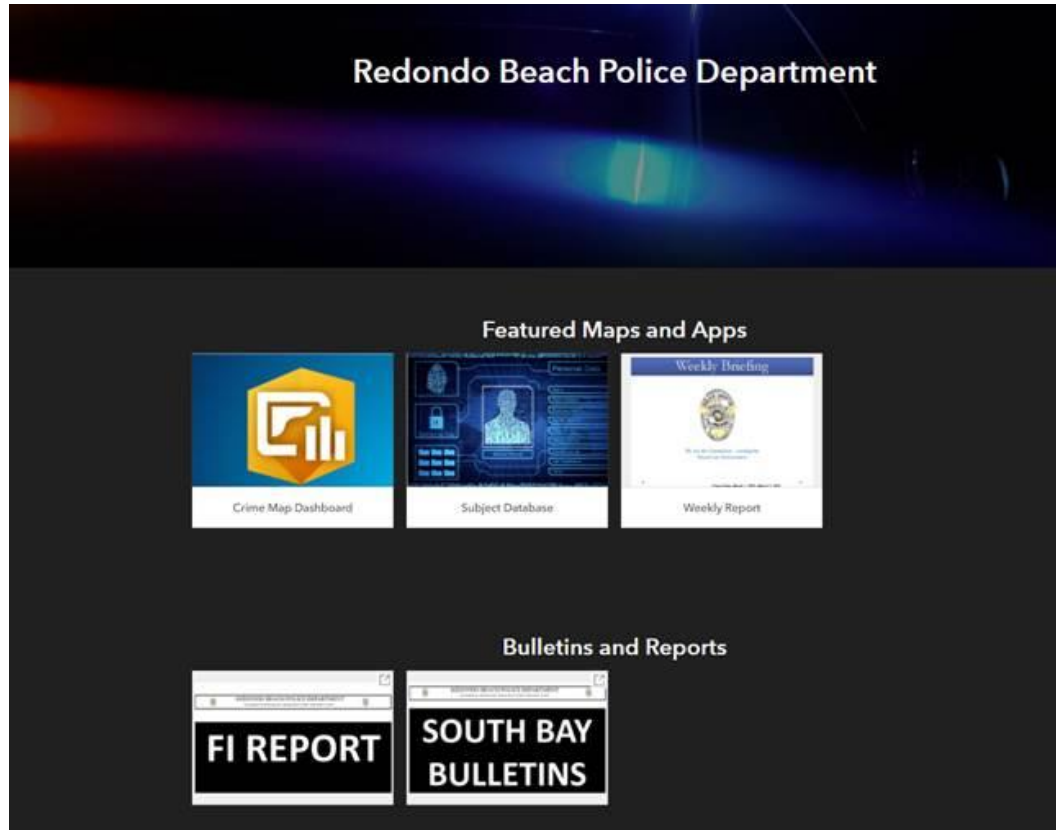
