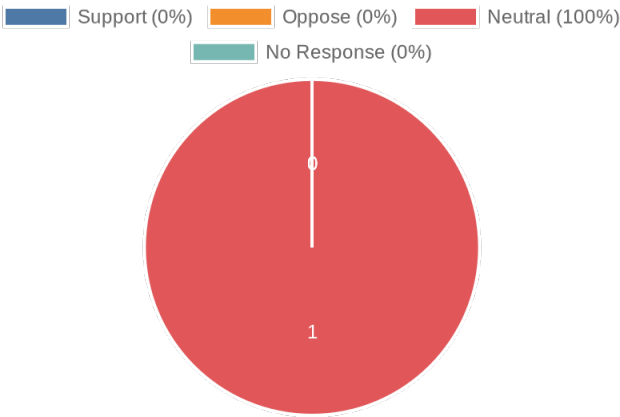

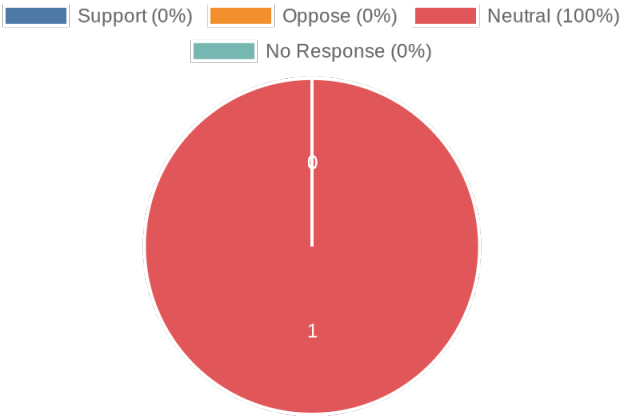

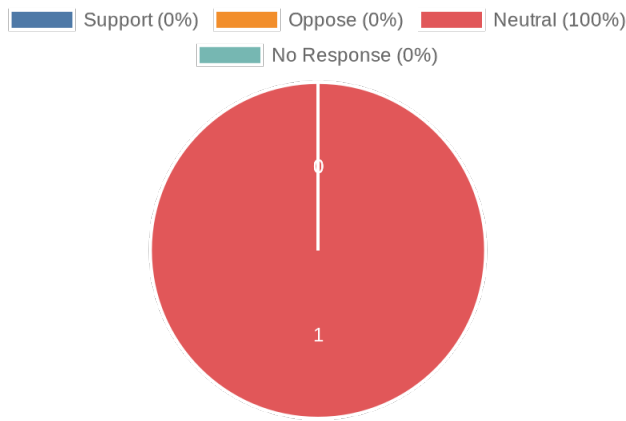

Examining the projects listed on the agenda I see there is over \$1.1 Million Dollars allocated to developing a \$17 Million Dollar police gun range. Having followed this item when it was on the city council agenda I am surprised we are still spending money on the gun range.

Allegedly most of the cost was to be covered with Federal grant funds with the city putting up about \$3 to \$5 Million. The current trend of cost cutting from the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) should demonstrate to everyone it's unlikely any funds will ever be available.

The \$1.1 Million dollars being spent to submit a grant that will never be fulfilled seems a colossal waste of time and money.
