#### H.1. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Chair Varvarigos opened the floor to public comments. The following individual(s) spoke:

Sarah Martin, Secretary of the Redondo Beach Sailing Club, spoke on the membership history of the club and the former agreements made by the City and the club. Continued to add the City's bidding process and the club not receiving a formal response to the City's denial regarding the bid.

Motion by Commissioner Escontrias, seconded by Chair Varvarigos, to approve additional public comment time to Sarah Martin. Motion carried with no objection.

Motion by Chair Varvarigos, seconded by Vice Chair Lang, to receive and file the documents submitted by Sarah Martin. Motion carried with no objection.

Vice Chair Lang inquired about the proper protocol regarding public comments and asking questions.

Senior Management Analyst Orta provided clarification regarding the process.

Ronifo Fernandez, former resident of 215 South Broadway, spoke on his life and experiences in Redondo Beach. Inquired about resources for homeless individuals.

Chair Varvarigos noted that services are available at the Police Department.

Recreation Supervisor Pinedo further clarified that services are available in the Redondo Beach Police Department.

#### J. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION PRIOR TO ACTION

Vice Chair Lang inquired about the comments received from Sarah Martin.

Commissioner Escontrias added that the non-profit inability to work as a vendor and second the use of the slips until someone is selected and how that is being utilized.

Senior Management Analyst Orta provided an update and noted that there are sailing classes and sailing club aspects that are connected. Students from the sailing classes can graduate and be part of the sailing club, but there is no direct affiliation between the City and the Sailing Club. City Council gave direction to staff to see how to incorporate the slips at Portofino Marina and if the City complies with the Coastal Act. Further noted the next key steps.

Vice Chair Lang inquired about continued components by the City and the Sailing Club.

Senior Management Analyst Orta confirmed what steps the City has taken regarding the Sailing Club.

Recreation Supervisor Pinedo in addition, noted that the City needs an agreement with insurance in place for that organization to use the vessels.

Commissioner Korman-Sooper and Chair Varvarigos suggested for a motion to have this item return for further discussion and direction by the Commission.

Commissioner Escontrias noted that based on information he had received, staff decided to move to a bidding process for the use of the City sailboats.

Recreation Supervisor Pinedo provided clarification that City staff did contact the recipients that submitted proposals to inform them of the City's decision and further noted that current staff was not part of the initial discussion and has made decisions based on direction of the City Council.

Senior Management Analyst Orta recommended that the Commission request for the item to be agendized to a future date and allow for staff to provide any and all information regarding this topic.

Motion by Commissioner Escontrias, to agendize a discussion regarding the issues concerning the Sailing Club and the use of slips moving forward. There was not a second made to this motion.

Vice Chair Lang requested for the report to include the various steps.

Commissioner Korman-Sooper requested for additional staff to be present to provide all information.

Chair Varvarigos requested for staff to provide a report with all information but that the Sailing Club needs to have a separate conversation with the City regarding the process.

Commissioner Escontrias further noted his concernes, including: 1) the selection process concerning a sailing club to use certain facilities; 2) the slip itself and if not approved, no one should be using the facility; and 3) the timeline of the treatment of the Sailing Club.

Vice Chair Lang noted concerns that if organizations have had volunteers provide service for the City for an extended time, the City should communicate properly.

Commissioner McCauley recommended that the Commission ask for a simple report and also inquired about the evaluation process to determine who the vendor is and how much the weight of the former relationship is in the process and selection.

Senior Management Orta recommended that the Commission make a formal motion to agendize this discussion to a future meeting.

Motion by Commissioner McCauley, seconded by Vice Chair Lang, to agendize the item on the sailing program to a future meeting and receive an update on all points relevant as stated tonight (legal, insurance, and vendor selection process). Motion carried unanimously, with no objection.

# J.1. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE INPUT ON THE CITY'S FY 2023/24 BUDGET

Senior Management Analyst Orta provided a brief overview regarding the item and noted that the item is for consideration to provide recommendations to the City Council regarding the budget.

Vice Chair Lang inquired on the cover for the dugout at Julie Field and if it would be included in the improvements discussed.

Commissioner McCauley confirmed that the cover for the dugout, the new backstops, the priority of adding a new field or look at an option location as well as improvements to the Alta Vista Park, were provided to staff.

Vice Chair Lang asked for drinking fountains or water bottle refill stations to be installed at Wilderness Park to be added to the budget discussion.

Commissioner Korman-Sooper inquired if any parks or parquettes need to be re-done.

Senior Management Analyst Orta provided an update that the Public Works Department did previously develop a conditions report for each location through a joint assessment with Los Angeles County.

Vice Chair Lang added another recommendation for budget discussion is more trees at the parks.

Commissioner McCauley inquired about fields at the schools to be added to the budget discussion.

Senior Management Analyst Orta noted that Commissioner McCauley's request wasn't an appropriate budgetary consideration.

Chair Varvarigos opened the floor to public comments. The following individual(s) spoke:

Recreation Manager Pinedo read the comments submitted via eComment by David Martin.

Seeing no additional requests to speak, Chair Varvarigos closed the floor to public comments.

Chair Varvarigos added an additional recommendation to the budget for consideration of a Park Ranger position. Commissioner McCauley suggested the Commission hold a future discussion regarding the Park Ranger to determine whether to make a recommendation to the City Council.

Senior Management Analyst Orta suggested for two motions to be placed. One motion regarding the budget recommendations and a second motion to include the Park Ranger position and noted that if the Park Ranger position is agendized to a future meeting staff can return with data from other cities.

Motion by Commissioner McCauley, seconded by Commissioner Korman-Sooper, to receive and file the recommendations as provided by the Commissioners to the City Council regarding the budget. Motion carried unanimously, with no objection.

Senior Management Analyst Orta provided information on the Historical Commission's recommended inclusion of historical timeline signs at Dominguez Park.
