
PROPOSED PROJECT: Project scope consists of installing signage within the City's right-of-way that serves to restrict parking between the hours of 2 AM and 6 AM on the South Side of Herondo Street between Pacific Coast Highway and North Francisca Avenue.

In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15060 (c)(2) and (3), and Section 15378 of the CEQA Statute and Guidelines, the above-referenced project is Categorically Exempt from the requirement for preparation of environmental review documents pursuant to:

Pursuant to Section 15060 (c)(2) and (3), and Section 15378 of the CEQA Statute and Guidelines the action to restrict parking is exempt from preparation of environmental review documents under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), as the activity is not considered a "project," and the action will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment. The project scope consists of installing signage within the City's right-of-way that serves to restrict parking between the hours of 2 AM and 6 AM on the South Side of Herondo Street between Pacific Coast Highway and North Francisca Avenue.

The project is consistent with those actions outlined as exempt from environmental review under the Guidelines for Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act,

The subject street is not designated as a scenic highway and the improvement activity is not a successive activity that will cause cumulative effects, nor will the additional parking restrictions cause effects due to unusual circumstances. The subject site is not located within an area designated as an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern, nor within a hazardous waste site included on any list compile pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code, nor within a designated historic district, nor is it a historic resource. The project is not a successive project in the same place that may have a cumulative impact over time, nor will the project have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.
