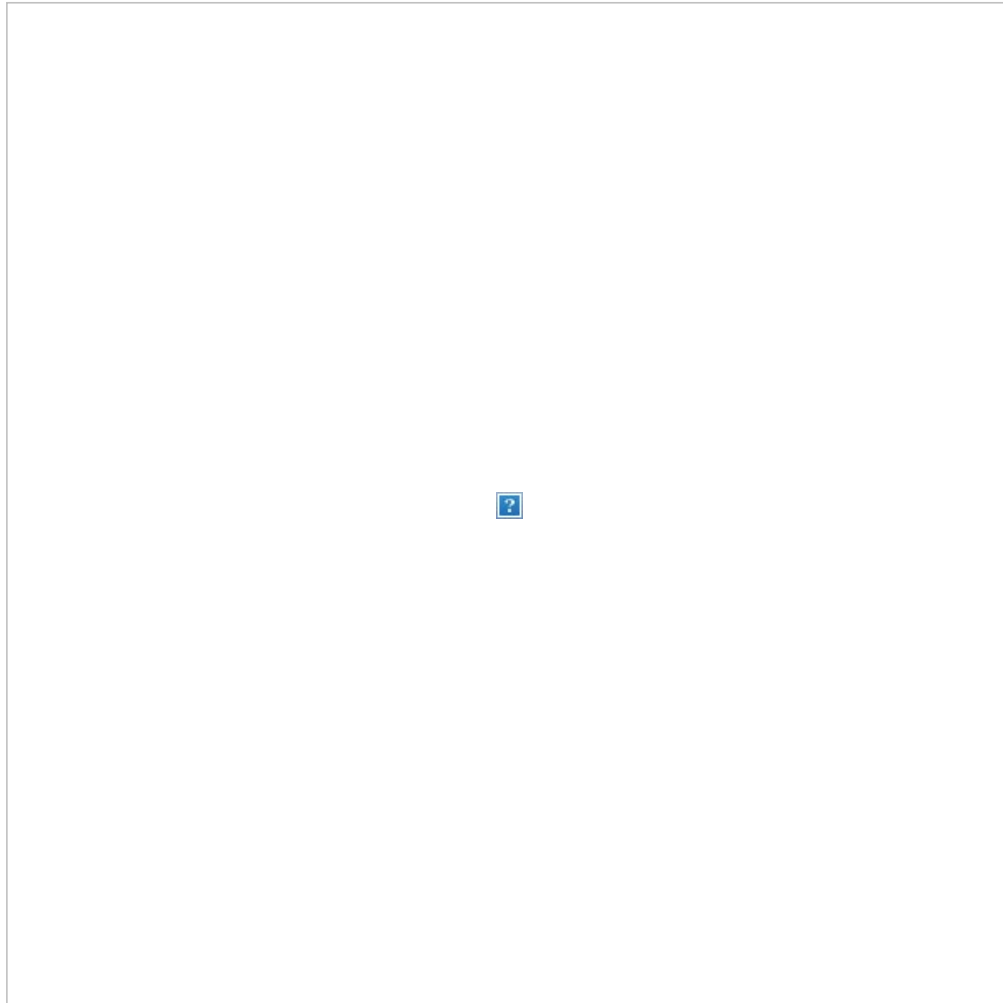

Public Comment

For generations, the surrounding neighborhoods have endured noise, traffic, pollution, chronic stress (the Blue Zones "silent killer") and property value decline from the failed hospital project. In 1984 after only 24 years of operation, the public owned and operated hospital closed due to impending financial failure and leased the hospital building and operations to a private hospital company. The private hospital operation closed in 1998 for good, leaving voters without the hospital they authorized and paid for. Our community's vote for a public emergency hospital failed.

BCHD cannot be allowed to create another 5 GENERATIONS of damages to the surrounding neighborhoods.

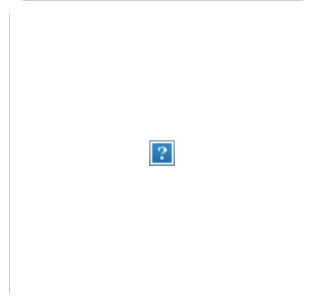

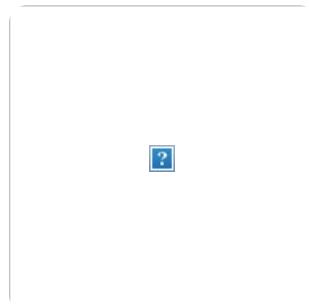
