Michael Webb, City Attorney of Redondo Beach,

As you know, Redondo Beach's City Council has requested that you amend and update our local ordinances to establish No Smoking and No Camping ordinances at the HomeKey-Moonstone Homeless Shelter at 716 S Pacific Coast Highway, like those required for HUD Public Housing. We understand an NGO purchased it; but really Moonstone should be considered public since our tax dollars bought it\*.

Additionally, the Council has requested that you create an anti-camping parks ordinance. We support all these requests.

The Moonstone property shares boundary lines with residents with young children (in fact a trampoline is only 2 feet away from the property line) and with seniors suffering from acute asthma.

We want to create a good long-term relationship with Moonstone. Enacting these basic requirements would greatly help.

Please give us a timeline when you will draft all these documents.

\*Century's HomeKey-Moonstone Project is a "Transitional Housing Shelter" for Redondo Beach homeless. Redondo Besch Municipal Code 4-34.02 requires a 500-yard radius for no "Unlawful Camping." This should be posted and fully enforced to clarify and protect affected surrounding Redondo Beach businesses and neighboring young residential family units. Furthermore, Redondo's "Pallet Shelters" have a 500 yard "Buffer" zone around them.
