#### Several corrective actions available to RBHA:

- 1. Administrative Plan Updates
  - a) Right-sizing voucher unit sizes
  - b) Establishing a minimum rent of \$50
  - c) Billing all incoming portability vouchers
- 2. Implementation of HUD Shortfall Guidelines
  - a) Adjusting payment standards
  - b) Denying move to higher-cost units
  - c) Delay rent increases
- 3. Contingency Planning
  - a) Identify unrestricted funds to offset shortfall
  - b) Outline procedures for potential terminations, if necessary
- 4. Independent Financial Review
