

Overall Sentiment









The 500-600 N Prospect Ave. Residents have been seeking remedies to speeding, lack of traffic control & enforcement, safety issues, noise created by speeding traffic, illegal exhausts, loud audio, and the Beach Cities Health District. Our privacy and any sound buffer or safety barrier was removed under the direction of Deputy Public Works Director Mike Kline while under Mayor Light's watch. Glad to see this item for discussion! I support increasing the floor area ratio on Aviation and Artesia from 0.6 to 1.5 to create flexibility and new development opportunities. However as staff indicates, if we maintain the same parking requirements (Redondo Beach code requires 1 parking space for every 4 seats in a restaurant, 1 space for every 250 sq ft of floor area in takeout or "pedestrian-oriented" restaurants and commercial spaces) redevelopment will not be viable. The work of UCLA Parking Scholar Donald Shoup and the Parking Reform Network show that parking requirements in land use codes are often arbitrary and not based on rigorous science. They are an impediment to redevelopment and to the creation of more walkable storefronts and business districts. Our most cherished business districts and community spaces are those built before cars and parking requirements.

Therefore, I support removing parking requirements altogether from the zoning for the Artesia and Aviation Corridor, and allowing market forces and customer research to drive parking need. Minneapolis, Austin, and Portland have eliminated parking requirements in recent years, and these reforms have helped reduce car dependency, improve public health, and lower housing costs (https://e360.yale.edu/features/free-parking-reform). I also support allowing mixed-use development with residential above commercial on Artesia and Aviation to encourage much-needed housing for young professionals, young families, and seniors in the community, and foster a dedicated base of customers to the corridor. South Bay Forward recently hosted a talk about livable and affordable communities with Tony Jordan of the Parking Reform Network. See their website: https://parkingreform.org/

Finally, let's listen to the merchants who were surveyed: 18/24 indicated parking requirements were the largest barrier to redevelopment and 17/24 indicated flexible zoning regulations would help to redevelop properties. Increasing FAR, eliminating parking requirements, and allowing mixed-use zoning will help revitalize the corridor.
