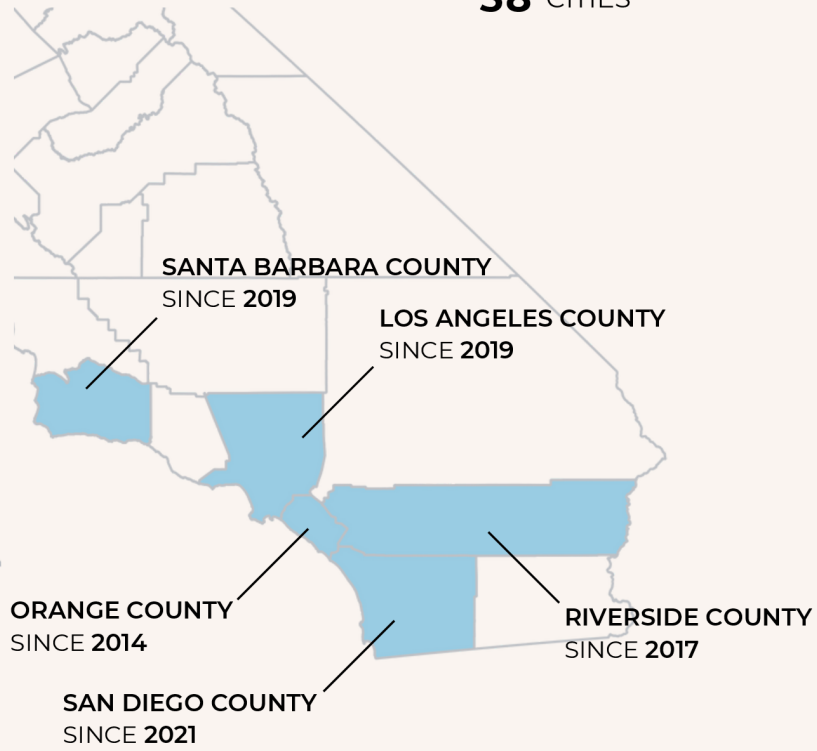

LOOKING AHEAD

City Net understands that homelessness is a complex challenge experienced by individuals and families with unique stories, dreams, and barriers to securing housing. We remain steadfast in our resolve to provide transformative care and innovative housing solutions to break the cycle of homelessness and guide our clients as they build a safe foundation from which to rebuild their lives. Here are a few milestones we look forward to accomplishing in 2024:

To kick off the new year, we were excited to partner with the County of Orange to coordinate and facilitate the Orange County Point in Time Count for the third time. The count and survey data provided vital information to help the County of Orange and the Orange County Continuum of Care (CoC) better understand the specific needs of the local community and will guide the response to homelessness across Orange County.

With the support of volunteers and agencies throughout Orange County, we mobilized over 1,000 volunteers to conduct the survey and distributed thousands of hygiene and snack kits to individuals and families experiencing unsheltered homelessness. We conduct major data collection activities like this across the state and as part of our commitment to offering dynamic, evidence-based approaches to ending homelessness.

Another program we look forward to implementing across the state is CalAIM (California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal), a community-based initiative designed to focus efforts on whole-person health for Medi-Cal enrollees experiencing homelessness or housing instability by improving access to coordinated health and social services. CalAIM will allow us to expand our capacity to better serve our most vulnerable neighbors, connecting them to tailored, life-changing care including assistance to maintain safe and stable tenancy after being housed.

We are excited to continue retention and supportive services efforts to ensure that those who have made their way home are equipped with the tools they need to successfully remain housed and not return to an experience of homelessness.
