Dear PWSC Commissioners:

I am speaking on the very limited topic of the red curb painting that the Commission previously approved for the 500-600 block of N Prospect frontage to keep a clear view of the bus stop.

To refresh your memories, this was predicated by an email from LA County to then Director Semaan regarding child predator investigations on the frontage road in the proximity of the Layne water tanks for salt water intrusion pumping. LA County explained to the Director that they use high brightness lighting to maintain a safe area around their tank due to the predator investigation.

I would like to recommend that you split the approval for additional 10 to 15 feet of red curb behind the bus stop from the more general traffic control and safety issues on the frontage and approve the painting activity. This is a de minimis task, I will offer to donate funding as needed.

500-600 Prospect Neighborhood Update on City Council Meeting (2-10-26)

Tuesday night's City Council meeting had a public-led discussion on internet porn, youth internet use, child predators, and neighborhood traffic problems during the public comment.

The first commenters discussed the City's failure to deal with traffic issues in a 25 MPH residential area over by Alta Vista School. The couple described parents cutting through neighborhoods to avoid Prospect and Knob Hill streets, illegal turners, speeders, and parents blowing through stop signs. They came looking for

help and their Councilmember was "volunteered" by the rest of the Council to help them out. Good luck to them. If we didn't have Darryl Boyd championing our local safety cause, we wouldn't be making any progress.

The second commenter was a local resident and an expert in the horrible impacts of child pornography, the internet and child predators. She highlighted work that was currently being done to reduce the risks of the internet and subsequent in-person child predator contacts with children.

For my 3 minute comment, **I reminded the current City Council of the child predator investigation on the frontage road** that was communicated to us by the RB Public Works Director. He learned of it from LA County. As a result of the investigation, the County deploys security lighting whenever they leave equipment on the frontage overnight, especially by the bus stop.

I reminded the Council and City Manager that we had secured Safety Commission approval to **paint the curb red in front the entire bus stop as an anti-child predator measure to assure we have a clear view for the safety of children and the frequent ALLCOVE teens that use the stop**. Research also shows that having clear view into bus stops increases safety for all users - the elderly, disabled, commuters and others.


I also thanked the new Police Chief, the City Manager and of course Darryl Boyd for their hard work to get motorcycle officers on the frontage and Big Prospect last week. Chief Sprengel has been briefed on our wrong way traffic, illegal U-turns, noise and speeding, and the Child Predator investigation on the frontage. **I plan to follow up tomorrow to discuss the curb paint, continued traffic enforcement, and child predator patrols.**

As I arrived home after the meeting, the RBPd had 2 units down on Diamond with a couple suspects on the curb. We've been having more and more late night/early morning issues at our bus stop with teen/early 20's youth and all age transients and un-housed.

That's a key reason we keep on the City to paint the curb red as recommended by the Redondo Beach Public Safety Commission so that vehicles don't block the view of the bus stop from the houses nearby as a safety measure.

Here's a quick pic from my phone of RBPd activity down on Diamond Street last night. It could just have easily been at our bus stop instead. See the RBPd red/blue lights down on Diamond right past the car parked in front of the bus stop.
