Hope you and yours are healthy.

I noticed that tonight the City Council will address people wearing masks during this horrific pandemic which will sadly continue into 2021.

We've been informed that wearing masks will reduce the spread of COVID. If this is correct, then we need to encourage this behavior in order to protect Redondo Beach residents.

I 'heard' that there is an exception for people exercising outside, is this correct? If not, yesterday (08/03/20), I saw several groups of whom appear to be high school runners both on the Esplanade and the Strand - not wearing masks or social distancing (see example in attached picture) while passing by hundreds - probably actually thousands - of other people. Also, I observed groups of cyclists where only approximately 50% were wearing masks. In addition, I estimate that only about 65% of people walking on the Esplanade and Strand are wearing masks.

Plus when people see other select groups of people not being required to wear masks, they tend to feel that they shouldn't have to wear masks either. I hate wearing a mask especially when I am walking, but I do it for my own and others' protection.



Perhaps the City could have masks with the Redondo Beach or school logos; this would facilitate a sense of community unity (https://www.bravegowns.com/products/custom-ribbon-masks). Of course, I'd love to see masks with the Keep the Esplanade Beautiful logo as this would add a local environmental perspective.

City Clerk Manzano, Mayor Brand and all City Council members,

I reviewed the Agenda item O1 and Resolution CC -20080958 that is on today's City Council Meeting agenda. Before approving the City's resolution on recommendation of use of face coverings during the Covid-19 emergency, I recommend you discuss making the resolution a requirement with penalties rather than just a recommendation. We have already been recommending face coverings for months. There is not enough compliance. Has the City Council explored what will be required to enforce a resolution on face coverings that involves fines for non compliance? We really need to explore the seriousness of the situation and continue this discussion before approving only a recommendation.

According to the latest Los Angeles Count Department of Public Health, the City of Redondo Beach currently shows 403 positive cases of Covid-19. There has been a continual increase in cases each day during the past month. I continue to see many residents in South Redondo walking in my neighborhood without face coverings. Our neighboring beach cities of Manhattan Beach and Hermosa Beach recently voted on and adopted City ordinances on face covering requirements during the current emergency. Please consult with their plans and how their ordinance is working out.

Our City has the Pier, the beaches, bike path and many city parks along with busy business districts like Riviera Village & the nearby Esplanade. All of these areas attract crowds and are high traffic areas where social distancing is not always possible. Residents and visitors will take the face covering requirement more seriously if there is active City enforcement. We as a City need to do as much as possible to protect all residents and visitors from community spread of Covid-19 and really need to adopt a stronger resolution.

Please consider the use of an outside agency, if needed, to patrol the most highly dense areas of our City and make face covering compliance a priority. Fines of between \$100 to \$500 could apply.

We all want business to get back to "normal" and schools to reopen for in class instruction, but until we do as much as possible as a City to stop the spread, we will see more confirmed cases.
