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SUPPLEMENTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES AND CITY OF REDONDO BEACH

This Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this <u>iot had and the country of Los Angeles ("County") and CITY OF REDONDO BEACH ("Public Entity.")</u>

RECITALS

- (a) Whereas, the Public Entity is desirous of contracting with the County for the performance of the supplemental law enforcement functions described herein by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department ("Sheriff's Department"); and
- (b) Whereas, the County is agreeable to rendering such supplemental law enforcement services within the County on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement; and
- (c) Whereas, this Agreement is authorized by the provisions of Section 56-1/2 and/or 56-3/4 of the Charter of the County of Los Angeles and/or Section 51301 of the California Government Code; and
- (d) Whereas, the County is agreeable to rendering such supplemental law enforcement services, as available, on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, and for good and valuable consideration, the parties mutually agree as follows:

1.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

1.1 The County agrees, as available, through the Sheriff's Department, to provide supplemental law enforcement services in the form of Court security services to the Public Entity to protect the health and welfare of Court patrons and employees, and

to ensure an orderly and safe event.

- 1.2 The specific services to be provided each month shall be as set forth in the Operations Plan, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Torrance Superior Courthouse Event Action Plan. The Operations Plan describes the event, its location, the date thereof, a general description of the services, and personnel to be provided. In the event that the services change, a new Operations Plan shall be reflected in a revised Exhibit A and attached to this Agreement as an Amendment consistent with Section 8.0, Amendments, of this Agreement to reflect any updates.
- 1.3 The classification and approximate numbers of personnel provided by the County shall be determined and mutually agreed upon by the Sheriff's Department and the Public Entity prior to the provision of supplemental law enforcement services, and set forth in an operations plan which shall be attached hereto as Exhibit A, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Torrance Superior Courthouse Event Action Plan, to this Agreement and incorporated herein by this reference. The hours of duty performed by County employees will be established and agreed upon in accordance with the requested supplemental law enforcement services.
- 1.4 The request for supplemental law enforcement services shall be a written request on official Public Entity letterhead. The request shall contain specific dates of service, hours of operation, number of personnel requested, classification of personnel requested, and duties and responsibilities associated with the type of service requested.
- 1.5 The request shall be signed by a representative of the Public Entity who is duly authorized to enter into such agreements for supplemental law enforcement services. The request shall be submitted to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Contract Law Enforcement Bureau located at:
 - 211 W. Temple Street, 7th Floor

Los Angeles, California 90012.

1.6 For the purpose of performing said services, County shall furnish and supply, as available, all necessary labor, supervision, personnel, helicopters, equipment,

- communications, fuel, and supplies necessary to provide the supplemental law enforcement services to be rendered hereunder. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Public Entity may provide additional resources for the County to utilize in the performance of the supplemental law enforcement services.
- 1.7 If applicable, the Public Entity hereby grants to the County, the Sheriff's Department, and its personnel responding to requests for supplemental law enforcement services herein the right to transmit and broadcast communications to the Public Entity's police department's units via the primary dispatch frequency and/or any other law enforcement frequency for which the Public Entity is licensed by FCC. Communication Plan shall be set forth in an operations plan which shall be attached hereto as Exhibit A, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Torrance Superior Courthouse Event Action Plan.
- 1.8 Except as otherwise specifically set forth in this Agreement, supplemental law enforcement services shall encompass duties and functions within the jurisdiction of and customarily rendered by the Sheriff's Department under the Charter of the County and the statutes of the State of California.

2.0 ADMINISTRATION OF PERSONNEL

- 2.1 In the event of a dispute between the parties to this Agreement as to the extent of the duties and functions to be rendered hereunder, or the minimum level or manner of performance of such service, the Public Entity shall be consulted and a mutual determination thereof shall be made by both the Sheriff's Department and the Public Entity
- 2.2 The rendition of the services performed by the Sheriff's Department, the discipline of officers, and other matters incident to the performance of such services and the control of personnel so employed shall remain with the County.
- 2.3 With regard to Paragraphs 2.1 and 2.2 above, in the event of an unresolved dispute over the minimum level of performance of services, the County shall have final and conclusive determination as between the parties hereto.

- 2.4 All Public Entity employees who work in conjunction with the Sheriff's Department pursuant to this Agreement shall remain employees of the Public Entity and shall not have any claim or right to employment, civil service protection, salary, or benefits or claims of any kind from the County based on this Agreement. No Public Entity employees shall become employees of the County.
- 2.5 For the purpose of performing services and functions pursuant to this Agreement and only for the purpose of giving official status to the performance thereof and not to establish an agency relationship, every County officer and/or employee engaged in performing any such service and function shall be deemed to be an officer or employee of the Public Entity while performing such service for the Public Entity, as long as the service is within the scope of this Agreement and is a Public Entity function.
- 2.6 The Public Entity shall not be called upon to assume any liability for the direct payment of any Sheriff's Department salaries, wages, or other compensation to any County personnel performing services hereunder for said Public Entity. Except as herein otherwise specified, the Public Entity shall not be liable for compensation or indemnity to any County employee or agent of the County for injury or sickness arising out of his/her employment as a contract employee of the Public Entity.
- 2.7 As part of its compliance with all applicable laws and regulations relating to employee hiring, the County agrees that the County Civil Service Rules to which it is subject and which prohibit discrimination on the basis of non-merit factors, shall for purposes of this Agreement be read and understood to prohibit discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation.

3.0 INDEMNIFICATION

Public Entity shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, its Special Districts, elected and appointed officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all liability, including but not limited to demands, claims, actions, fees, costs, and expenses (including attorney and expert witness fees), arising from or

- connected with the Public Entity's acts and/or omissions arising from and/or relating to this Agreement.
- 3.2 County shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Public Entity, its Special Districts, elected and appointed officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all liability, including but not limited to demands, claims, actions, fees, costs, and expenses (including attorney and expert witness fees), arising from or connected with the County's acts and/or omissions arising from and/or relating to this Agreement.

4.0 TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall commence October 1, 2020 or upon execution by the Sheriff, whichever is later, and shall terminate June 30, 2021, unless sooner terminated or extended in whole or in part as provided for herein.

5.0 RIGHT OF TERMINATION

- 5.1 Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving not less than sixty (60) calendar days advance written notice to the other party.
- Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Sheriff may cancel the provision of services with only ten (10) calendar days advance notice, or less in the event of exigent circumstances, if the Sheriff concludes that there are insufficient personnel to provide the agreed upon services and still perform other Sheriff's duties as required by law.
- 5.3 In the event of a termination, each party shall fully discharge all obligations owed to the other party accruing prior to the date of such termination, and, except as otherwise provided herein, each party shall be released from all obligations, which would otherwise accrue subsequent to the date of termination.

6.0 BILLING RATES

6.1 For and in consideration of the rendition of the supplemental law enforcement services to be performed by the County for the Public Entity under this Agreement,

the Public Entity shall pay County for said services provided by County under the terms of this Agreement at the appropriate and prevailing billing rates set forth on Exhibit B, Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Rates, as established by the County Auditor-Controller. The billing rates listed shall be readjusted annually by the County Auditor-Controller effective July 1 of each year to reflect the cost of such service. In such case, the annual rate adjustment shall be reflected in a revised Exhibit B and attached to this Agreement as an Amendment consistent with Section 8.0, Amendments, of this Agreement to reflect the change in billing rates each fiscal year.

Rates, are developed and deemed appropriate by the County Auditor-Controller to reflect the County's actual costs in the compensation of employees at premium overtime rates (except Deputy Sheriff - Reserves), the administration of workers' compensation benefits, and the overhead of the County attributable to the provision of services pursuant to this Agreement. The foregoing rates are adjusted annually pursuant to the policies and practices adopted by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors governing the determination of such actual costs.

7.0 PAYMENT PROCEDURES

- 7.1 The County, through the Sheriff's Department, shall render to the Public Entity a summarized invoice which covers all services performed during said month, and the Public Entity shall pay County for all undisputed amounts within sixty (60) calendar days after date of said invoice.
- 7.2 If such payment is not delivered to the County office, which is described on said invoice, within sixty (60) calendar days after the date of the invoice, the County is entitled to recover interest thereon. For all disputed amounts, the Public Entity shall provide the County with written notice of the dispute including the invoice date, amount, and reasons for dispute within ten (10) calendar days after receipt of the invoice. The parties shall memorialize the resolution of the dispute in writing. For

any disputed amounts, interest shall accrue if payment is not received within sixty (60) calendar days after the dispute resolution is memorialized.

7.3 Said interest shall be at a rate of ten percent (10%) per annum or any portion thereof, calculated from the date payment was due pursuant to Paragraphs 7.1 and 7.2 above.

8.0 AMENDMENTS

All changes, modifications, or amendments to this Agreement must be in the form of a written Amendment duly executed by authorized personnel of the County and the Public Entity, with the exception of Exhibit A, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department – Torrance Superior Courthouse Event Action Plan, and Exhibit B, Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Rates, which shall become Amendments to the Agreement but do not require the signature of either party.

9.0 ASSIGNMENT, DELEGATION, AND SUBCONTRACTING

A party shall not assign its rights and/or subcontract, or otherwise delegate, its duties under this Agreement, either in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the other party, and any attempted assignment or delegation without such consent shall be null and void.

10.0 AUTHORIZATION WARRANTY

The Public Entity represents and warrants that the person executing this Agreement for the Public Entity is an authorized agent who has actual authority to bind the Public Entity to each and every term, condition, and obligation of this Agreement and that all requirements of the Public Entity have been fulfilled to provide such actual authority.

11.0 GOVERNING LAW, JURISDICTION, AND VENUE

This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of California. The parties agree and consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the State of California for all purposes regarding this Agreement and further agree and

consent that venue of any action brought hereunder shall be exclusively in the County of Los Angeles.

12.0 NOTICES

Unless otherwise specified herein, all notices or demands required or permitted to be given or made under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be hand delivered with signed receipt or mailed by first class registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the parties at the following addresses and to the attention of the person named. Addresses and persons to be notified may be changed by either party by giving ten (10) calendar days prior written notice thereof to the other party.

13.0 VALIDITY

If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this Agreement and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

14.0 WAIVER

No waiver by the parties of any breach of any provision of this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any other breach or of such provision. Failure of the parties to enforce at any

time, or from time to time, any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver thereof.

15.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement, including Exhibit A, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department – Torrance Superior Courthouse Event Action Plan, and Exhibit B, Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Rates, and any executed Amendments hereto or thereto, constitute the complete and exclusive statement of understanding of the parties which supersedes all previous agreements, written or oral, and all communications between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. No change to this Agreement shall be valid unless prepared pursuant to Section 8.0, Amendments, of this Agreement and signed by both parties.

Situation

In 2019 the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors provided funding to the South Bay Cities Council of Governments to administer Innovation Funds for Homeless Services in the South Bay. The City of Redondo Beach is the only jurisdiction awarded an Innovation grant to combat homelessness. A major component of the program is the once a month collaborative Homeless Court heard in Judge Rene Gilbertson's courtroom. The program offers an informal diversion program offering wrap around services such as mental health counseling, substance abuse treatment and housing placement. The success of the program has been in large part due to the hands-on approach of the community partners who transport clients to and from court and service providers in the South Bay. The Redondo Beach model is now the basis for Assemblyman Al Muratsuchi's Assembly Bill 2339 forming "Homeless Aid Courts."


Like it has in all areas, COVID-19 has drastically disrupted the normal operations of the Redondo Beach Homeless Court. COVID-19 has disproportionately affected the homeless population significantly increasing the danger to the transportation providers, community partners, attorneys, court staff, and Judges. In cooperation with the Public Defender, Alternate Public Defender, Sheriff's Department, Community Partners, City of Redondo Beach, South West District Administrator, Torrance Criminal Operations Manager, Judge Gilbertson; we are seeking to hold Homeless Court off-site in a secured open air location once a month beginning September 9th. This open-air location will eliminate the need to transport homeless defendants to and from court and service providers. The Court and wrap around services will all be on site in a safer environment offering "one-stop" services to this vulnerable population.

EXPENSES - There will be no expense to the Court. The City of Redondo Beach has agreed to cover all logistical needs including paying for necessary Sheriff personnel to provide security. If necessary, they will also indemnify the Court and Judicial Council.

LOCATION – Homeless court will be held in the fenced parking area located at 200 N. PCH, Redondo Beach, adjacent to the RBPD Detective Bureau and the Redondo Union High School Auditorium. This location is directly across the street from St. James Church which serves a daily lunch to the South Bay homeless.







Redondo Public Works Department will be providing all logistical support including ADA compliant bathrooms. The Redondo Beach Annex is 200 feet North to South and 234 feet East to West.

SECURITY - Located inside of open area, the courtroom would be visually screened from those outside of the fence line which will be obscured by meshing. The currently assigned bailiff for Dept. 2 would accompany Judge Gilbertson and provide "courtroom" security. An additional Deputy and Security Officers would secure the weapons screening and locker/property storage areas. The Redondo Beach Police Department will provide three additional uniformed police officers for security. The main gate located on the west side of the gated parking area will be left open approximately 10 feet. The 10 feet open area will be the only entrance/exit to the gated parking area. There will be two Security Officers manning the inner perimeter near weapon screening. In the event of an emergency, the Redondo Beach Police Department will transport to the local hospital. This also will include any police action in regard to the use of force. There are to be no persons remanded by the judge during the proceedings at this location. In the event an arrest is to be made outside of judicial court proceedings, the Redondo Beach Police Department will take the individual(s) into custody.

STAFF – The courtroom clerk and court reporter will remain at Torrance Court utilizing audio WebEx to communicate with the court proceedings being held in Redondo Beach.

Concept

The mission of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is to provide a high level of security for the Judges, court staff, involved parties, and patrons entering and exiting the courthouse. The general court order regarding media regulations prohibiting photography/filming in the courthouse, (see attached signed court order), will be strictly enforced by Sheriff's personnel, and media access will be granted based on court instructions. The Sheriff's Department will work closely with Redondo Beach Police Department, who have jurisdiction for any issues that occur at the location.

The Incident Commander's intent is to maintain a safe environment, and to minimize disruptions in and around the location by utilizing Redondo Beach personnel. Being that the situation is dynamic, it therefore will be subject to modification by the Incident Commander. In the event of a large media presence and possible protestors near the location one additional deputy have been assigned to the location, along with three Redondo Beach Police Officers.

Two Sheriff's Department Security Officers will be posted at the main entrance to perform weapon screening procedures Weapons screening personnel will be designated to coordinate all media, and direct them to the west side of the courtroom near the entrance. The general court order regarding media regulations prohibiting photography/filming in the courthouse will be strictly enforced by Sheriff's personnel.

When court is not in session, Judge Gilbertson will remain inside the Redondo Beach Detective Office. When court is ready, Judge Gilbertson will be escorted by two Redondo Beach Police Officers and will enter the courtroom from the west side entrance.

The building site judge, Judge Alan A. Honeycutt, Sheriff's Headquarters Social Media section (sibecomm@lasd.org) SOU Security Operations Unit, Department Operations Center (DOCINFO@LASD.ORG) and the Court's Public Information Officer (Mary Hearn, 213-830-0801) are all aware of the case.

Redondo Beach Police Department, Captain Jon Naylor will have units ready to respond, if the needed.

Arrest Procedures

All arrests by the LASD CSD West personnel will require the immediate notification to the concerned Incident Commander. A supervisor will respond to the scene of any arrest made by his personnel. The supervisor will also ensure that the arresting deputy write the arrest report. The supervisor will approve the report and the arrestee will be transported to Lomita Station, IRC, or CRDF for booking. The cases have been pre-screened and no issues of custody will involve court defendants.

Reporting Procedures

All Departmental reporting and case assignment procedures are in incidents involving any shots fired, use of force, injured personnel, etc. will be reported immediately to the Incident Commander. Any noteworthy incident involving members of the press or public officials will require immediate notification to the deputy's supervisor. The supervisor will be responsible for notifying the Incident Commander. These notifications may be followed with a written memorandum.

Timekeeping

Personnel will be compensated at the rate of time and one-half their hourly rate of pay over and beyond their normal work day. Any OT must be pre-approved prior to working.

Uniforms and Equipment

Personnel shall wear a Class "A" uniform. All Departmental grooming standards shall be in effect. All Department safety equipment, vest, Full Sam/Sally Browne, Handheld radio, Baton, O/C spray and Taser shall be worn and carried in an approved manner.
