Thank you for contacting me on this important matter. I support the installation of 2 additional STOP signs at the intersection of Blossom Lane and Vanderbilt Lane.

I have lived on Vanderbilt just East of this intersection for over 15 years. I frequently make left turns from Vanderbilt onto Blossom. I am have always been fearful of having an accident at this intersection. The main reason is the steep hill on Blossom for the cars going North leading up to the intersection with Vanderbilt. The steep hill makes it impossible to see oncoming traffic coming up the hill until it is almost too late to avoid them. I frequently have to apply my brakes at the last second to avoid cars coming up the hill. I have heard drives who are pressing on the gas pedal to climb the hill continue to keep the pedal down and are accelerating as they near this intersection.

At the other extreme, I have seen cars approaching this intersection on Blossom start to slow down as they expect there to be a stop sign at the top of the hill. There are so many intersections in the neighborhood that have stop signs that drivers expect there will be one where there is none. Some of the drivers on Blossom will see me inching my way out into the intersection and will stop and wave at me to go ahead even though they have the right of way. The cars that park on Blossom facing North on the South East and North East corners further block the vision of drivers on Vanderbilt approaching this intersection as only a short strip of the curbs on Blossom are painted red. I strongly encourage you to install 2 STOP signs on Blossom at this intersection as soon as possible to help alleviate this dangerous situation. I have mentioned this proposal to my neighbors on Vanderbilt who live beyond the 150ft radius and everyone I have spoken to agrees it poses a danger and there needs to be stop signs installed.

Based on my experience, the addition of stop signs at the intersection of Green Lane and Vanderbilt Lane are needed but of a lower priority than for Blossom. The visibility is better at the Green intersection and the risk of an accident is corresponding lower. I do use Rockefeller Lane and I support the installation of additional stop signs there as well.

I have mixed thoughts on the stop controls, I can only speak well for the stops on Vanderbilt, I don't travel Rockefeller as much.

I agree that the stop controls are a good thing if it means it'll help keep the speed racers that come through here daily -usually closer to night. Every night I brace myself that they're going to fly through and hit someone or their animals - although it's never happened.

Do we need a stop sign since it's a dangerous intersection? I'm not sure. Vanderbilt and Blossom maybe more than Vanderbilt and Green. It's a lot harder to see cars coming northbound on Blossom there. I worry a little bit that a 4-way stop at Vanderbilt and Green could cause some back up because with the light at the end on Artesia, sometimes the cars are backed up across that Green/Vanderbilt intersection already - but perhaps people will turn and go down different streets.

The biggest danger is that people don't even stop at the stop signs. Enforcing the stops has been my hot issue in all of my 15 years in Redondo. I've talked to every candidate who comes knocking on my door, I've talked to cops and any friends with any influence in the city. I've actually been told by a police officer that they will ticket people who roll through stops and then the person goes to the city and get them reversed so it's not even worth it. THAT is the biggest issue to keeping residents safe.
