






My son was super inquisitive and was around 8, he started asking what the green crosses on buildings were. As


Dear Mayor and Council Members,

Redondo Beach has an uphill battle in our goal of sunseting the AES power plant and we need everyone in the community to write and/or email the California State Water Board. AES, hired Lobbying companies Weideman Group & Carter Welch have spending \$235,000 in 2020 & 2021 combined actively engaging with CSWB staff. The lead for Weideman Group, Ryan McCarthy, worked with then LT Governor Gavin Newsom in his office so our task is even more difficult than just money but powerful relationships at work. Public records requests show an extremely familiar relationship between CSWB staff and the Lobbying Group. At the last hearing Weideman's staff were making suggestions on agenda formatting even proposing the speaking order that was adopted by CSWB staff to give AES and their support the last word. During one segment of the last meeting an AES consultant was emailing CSWB staff in real time with suggested questions for Councilman Horvath. Another speaker from Long Beach supporting the extension Assembly Member Patrick O'Donnell received \$4700 from AES including \$2700 just a couple of weeks after supporting their position of a Redondo plant at the hearing. AES has been fined, chastised and otherwise taken to task about the incredible damage done to Marine Life along with other environmental damage and yet continues to operate. Please provide residents the links and other information available for residents to let their voices be heard. Health & Safety before insider favor trading and influence peddling policy making.
