Commissioner Nafissi announced that she lives within the 500 radius of the 600 block of North Maria Avenue and thus, will be recusing herself.

Discussion followed regarding the restriction signage, permanent no-u turn signage, and possible hour restrictions.

Traffic Engineer Moshksar and Public Works Director Semaan responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification.

Chair Simpson opened the floor to public comments. The following individual(s) spoke:

Mandy Warchola spoke on some of the issues such as faculty from the school parking around the neighborhood, u-turns made by neighborhood residents, drop-off by parents lingering after dropping off kids and creating more traffic, required parking permits, and letter to parents with notification of the no u-turn.

Sheri James is opposed to the request, will increase commute time to work in the mornings. Suggested for the school to speak to the parents and have them use the school to drop-off their children.

Daniel Lasdow spoke on the principal having the ability to open other locations within the school for pick-up and drop-off of students.

Seeing no additional requests to speak, Chair Simpson closed the floor to public comments.

Discussion followed regarding other possible alternatives for traffic and planning, circulation plan for the school, traffic light crossing guard, traffic circulation problems, letter from Principal submitted to the Public Works Commission, parking restrictions during certain school hours, other signage options and ideas to better direct traffic, and giving the Principal direction on types of solutions prior to the City taking action.

Traffic Engineer Moshksar responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification.

Sheri James agrees that the Principal should take action and fix the school's circulation including signage.

Seeing no additional requests to speak, Chair Simpson closed the floor to public comments.

Public Works Director Semaan clarified that the City cannot encourage signage to be placed in the public's right-of-way due to safety concerns and signage can be placed anywhere around the school property.

Motion by Vice Chair Minne, to direct staff to work with the Principal to address the safety concerns regarding school traffic and develop options to assist with those concerns. Failed for lack of a second.

Traffic Engineer Moshksar responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification. Furthermore suggested maybe hour restrictions with the u-turn.

Public Works Director Semaan requested clarification from the maker of the motion.

Chair Simpson stated that he will be voting no because he believes something different should have been done then what the motion details.

Motion by Commissioner Funabashi, seconded by Vice Chair Minne, to deny the request for a u-turn restriction and encourage the Principal to seek further input from the neighbors around the school and student parents. Friendly amendment accepted by the make of the motion for the Principal to also work with City staff regarding solutions. Motion carried, with the following roll call vote:

J.2. CIRCULATION IMPROVEMENTS ON THE 500 BLOCK OF

N. HELBERTA AVE.

City Engineer Winje provided the PowerPoint presentation that included the following details:

- Background
- Proposed Design
- Alternatives
- Results
- Survey Results (All Responses and On the Block)
- Alternative Recommendations Available

Discussion followed regarding the next steps.

City Engineer Winje responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification.

Chair Simpson opened the floor to public comments. The following individual(s) spoke:

Maria Stefan spoke on the difficulty the limitation of parking would cause on North Helberta Avenue. Preferred for limited parking to go North.

Steve Bopp spoke on the issues with parking and vehicles blocking resident driveways and the issues with double parking. Spoke against the option of one-way street.

Susan Poland spoke on the issues throughout the years with moving vehicles and parked cars. Also, spoke on the speed from moving vehicles. Is not in support of a one-way street. Suggested other options on traffic restrictions during school hours.

Michael McNeirney spoke on the traffic and the proposed solution would not fix the problem. The only solution would be in making the street a one-way street during certain hours (school hours).

Neva Valenti spoke on the traffic issues during school hours, vehicles driving fast throughout the streets to drop off kids at school, and is in support if the street is a one-way street.

Commissioner Funabashi confirmed that the issues are arising during school hours.

Karen Corey spoke on the direction of the street and parent dropping off kids in certain areas close to school proximity and parents blocking driveways making it difficult for residents to leave their homes. Prefers the one-way restriction option and does not have a preference if it is a permanent one-way street or just during school hours.

Sandy Deery spoke about the lack of parking during school hours and issues with moving vehicles damaging parked vehicles. Is in support of the one-way street as a solution. The two-way traffic needs to be eliminated.

Edward Deery spoke in support of northbound one-way street. Spoke on the businesses of the street during school hours. Due to multiple issues the one-way street should be permanent at all times.

Katie Romero spoke about signage near the school to avoid traffic on some streets during school hours.

Ron Corey is in agreement with neighbors about a one-way street request. Spoke about students parking in the neighborhood and parking availability at the High School for the students to park. Inquired about permit parking for residents.

Neva Valenti inquired about the students having to pay parking to park

Discussion followed regarding survey patterns requests, pattern issues might more to Irena, one-way street options study, paid parking for high school students, talk to the school about circulation, alternate solutions to educate parents, collect data for one-way street volumes, part-time turn restrictions in conjunction with removing the center line, impacts on other streets if one-way street is implemented, survey sample received from residents, no removal of parking for residents, three-way by administration building, options for restricted turns, and issues on restrictive hours for a one-way street.

City Engineer Winje and Public Works Director Semaan responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification.

Principal Engineer Sablan confirmed that there were no eComments received.

Seeing no additional requests to speak, Chair Simpson closed the floor to public comments.

Discussion continued regarding the logistics of the motion and what the next steps consisted of.

Motion by Commissioner Funabashi, seconded by Chair Simpson, to make North Helberta a northbound one-way street, which will also necessitate the removal of the white line. A roll call vote was not made, as Vice Chair Minne stated that his concern is that additional options can be presented to the community.

City Engineer Winje and Public Works Director Semaan responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification.

Friendly amendment by Vice Chair Minne, seconded by Commissioner Nafissi, to study other solutions such as turn restrictions as a potential alternative for North Helberta in addition to the recommended one-way conversion and to advise residents of the options that will be presented for City Council consideration. Motion carried unanimously, with no objection.

Motion with friendly amendment to make Helberta Avenue a northbound one-way street and for City staff to explore other alternatives and to advise residents on the options that will be presented for City Council for consideration. Discussion followed the logistics of the request, the request that was made, and the study conducted for this request.

City Engineer Winje and Public Works Director Semaan responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification.

Scott Ventrudo stated for the record what the intention was for the request. The request is for safety purposes.

Discussion continued regarding the process for speed bumps, data provided on accidents, responses received differences between petition v mailed surveys, petition accessibility, and other alternatives available regarding the concerns from applicant.

City Engineer Winje and Public Works Director Semaan responded to the Commissioners' questions and provided clarification.

Motion by Commissioner Nafissi, seconded by Vice Chair Minne, to direct staff to evaluate other alternatives besides the stop sign and conduct a traffic calming measures. Motion carried unanimously, with the following roll call vote:
