Chief Deputy City Clerk Kroneberger announced there were no communications from the public on this item.

Motion by Member Elder, seconded by Member Bakaly, to approve the Consent Calendar, as presented. Motion carried, by roll call vote, with Members Stratton, Keller, Kauffman, Sharifi, Ketchum, Gausche-Hill and Ahn, absent.

E. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Chief Deputy City Clerk Kroneberger announced there were no eComments or public comments on this item.

F. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION PRIOR TO ACTION

F.1. SUMMARY OF CITY EMERGENCY ORDERS AND UPDATED CIRCUMSTANCES SINCE THE DISASTER COUNCIL MEETING OF MAY 27, 2020

Vice Chair Hoefgen discussed the City's response to the COVID-19 health crisis in terms of City operations; addressed the City's Emergency Order in response to the County-wide closure of beaches and piers; reported various facilities have reopened effective July 6th; complimented the public for their adherence and compliance and listed continuing closures in City facilities. He presented L.A. County and City COVID-19 statistics; reported the City will be receiving over \$800,000 in CARES funding but the City is still in a reduction mode in terms of the budget.

Chair Brand addressed reclosures ordered by the State; reported on beach closures in the County and thanked the public for their continued compliance.

Chief Deputy City Clerk Kroneberger announced there were no eComments or public comments on this item.

F.2. STATUS OF HOSPITAL ADMISSIONS/CAPACITY AND COVID-19 TESTING EFFORTS

Member Dr. Gausche-Hill presented updates on hospital admissions/capacity and COVID-19 testing efforts; addressed the COVID-19 burden at hospitals and concerns regard ICU beds; noted there is still capacity in the system; discussed concerns regarding ventilators; reported admissions and discharges are increasing; displayed cases and mortality rates in comparison with other states and increases in cases among younger populations. Member Dr. Gausche-Hill stated everyone has a social responsibility and urged people not to take this lightly. In terms of treatments and vaccines, she reported there are positive developments and felt the City is in good shape.

In response to Member Sanford's question regarding the ability of businesses to open within the next three months, Member Dr. Gausche-Hill stated they are projecting that there will still be capacity in four weeks and are working closely with Public Health and hospitals to keep them open and help balance the tension between the health of the economy, public health and the capacity of the healthcare system.

Jacquelyn Sun, Senior Policy Analyst, Beach Cities Health District, presented updated data on that State of COVID-19 in the County and Beach Cities including average daily new cases; reported the County has reported more deaths; noted Beach Cities are doing relatively well compared to the County; discussed trends, by week and month, positivity rates, cases and hospitalizations.

Dr. William Kim addressed statistics for local hospitals; confirmed hospital capacity; reported COVID-19 is affecting a younger population, not requiring the use of ventilators, and urged the public to use face coverings and practice social distancing.

Chair Brand shared information from a recent Sanitation District Board meeting including an increase in COVID-19 sewage at inlets to two wastewater treatment plants; noted once the virus passes through the digestive system, it is inactive but the information is indicative of how much the virus is, within the community.

In response to Member Sanders's question, Ms. Sun confirmed the number of cases in Beach Cities compared to those in L.A. County.

In reply to Vice Chair Hoefgen question regarding the availability of tests, Member Bakaly addressed testing capacity at the property on Prospect and Beryl; reported L.A. County is working on revising the test-reservation system and plans are to continue testing through July or August.

Ms. Sun added that the County is urging people with providers and insurance to contact their providers, first; discussed hot spot areas; addressed the opening of new County testing sites and spoke about the need for education and testing priorities.

In reply to Member McKenzie's question, Ms. Sun discussed challenges with the accuracy of anti-body testing.

Member McKenzie asked about the rate of recurrence and Dr. Kim noted there are many platforms available for anti-body testing, but they do not have good specificity and sensitivity while some of the larger laboratories have excellent platforms. He added there has been no increase in recurrence, but research is still in the works.

Member Dr. Gausche-Hill added the issue of reinfection is still not clear; reported as time goes, there will be a better understanding and noted challenges with anti-body testing. Currently, the best thing to do if experiencing symptoms, would be to get a PCR test. She discussed the types of tests including molecular (PCR) and the tests for anti-bodies and reportedly most everyone is doing PCR testing.

Chief Deputy City Clerk Kroneberger announced there were no eComments or public comments on this item.

F.3. STATUS OF COUNTY/CITY RECOVERY PLANNING EFFORTS

Member Semaan discussed working with the Riviera Village Association to help businesses with restrictions and helping restaurants expand into outdoor dining; addressed subsequent shut-down orders; reported receiving a waiver from the Coastal Commission to be able to expand into all parking lot areas and parklets and commented on the ability to use parkways and public rights-of-way areas for opportunities for businesses to participate.

Member McKenzie reported recently receiving the update to have increased space; stated she has visited some businesses in North Redondo that are creating additional spaces, outdoors and noted she will distribute information on how to obtain a temporary use permit. She added that businesses are becoming more creative in creating safe spaces to conduct business.

Director of Community Development Brandy Forbes addressed the temporary use permit process; noted City Council has chosen to waive related fees; reported development of an application packet for non-restaurant businesses including gyms and hair salons and indicated applicants can obtain additional information at planningredondo@redondo.org.

Member McKenzie asked for an explanation relative to why dining outdoors is safer than indoors, and Member Dr. Gausche-Hill reported it has to with airflow, availability of space for physical distancing and higher temperatures and addressed the efficiency of plastic face shields.

Member Bakaly and Ms. Sun provided an update on the Safe in the South Bay Program in collaboration with Chambers of Commerce in Beach Cities. Additional information can be found at redondochamber.org.

Member Ketchum referenced uses that closed with access to outdoor relief; complemented City staff and leadership for leading the initiative and asked for clarification of the Governor's order.

Director of Community Development Forbes listed business sectors included in the Governor's most-recent orders. She added this Council made a difference in getting businesses up and running.

Member Sanford stated it will get worse before it gets better; discussed businesses that have had to close because of the lack of outdoor space and reported it is up to the City to disseminate the information.

Member Ketchum addressed businesses in distress; noted programs available at the beginning of the crisis are now gone; reported many companies have spent money repositioning themselves and opined it behooves the City to project how long the current shut-down will last.

Vice Chair Hoefgen understood the latest shutdown will be until further notice; until the numbers get better.

Member Witzansky stated it is indefinite in the order, but the target is the end of the month.

Dr. Kim indicated there is a list of affected Counties; noted if cases go up in a three-day cycle, it triggers a shut-down.

Director of Community Development Forbes stated L.A. County is included in the watchlist and explained the businesses she listed earlier where the businesses that were shut down, as of Monday, if your county is on a watchlist.

Discussion followed regarding concerns with the policy, understanding that although cases are going up, it does not necessarily mean everything should be shut down and the possibility of City Council considering sending a letter to the County and State urging them to consider all impacts of shut-downs on the community; not just health impacts.

Chair Brand indicated the item will be agendized for consideration by City Council.

City Attorney Webb wondered whether Beach Cities would be on a watchlist if they were a County; proposed that treating a county as large as L.A. as a single entity is very different than

treating smaller counties and suggested asking them to break down the orders to not be county-specific.

Member Dr. Gausche-Hill agreed it is worth a shot and felt it makes sense to have more specificity relative to certain locations.

Chair Brand reported the County was considering dividing into hotspots, but the proposal was not approved.

Chair Brand invited public comments.

Peter Rockwood, small business owner, District 2, asked for an update on the moratorium on evictions for commercial tenants.

Vice Chair Hoefgen discussed actions by the City to put in place a moratorium on COVID-19 related evictions for residential and commercial tenants and reported that subsequently, the State took action that superseded the City's action and the City suspended the moratorium. Currently, the rules in place at the State and County levels are controlling the issue. He added the City, as a landlord, has received requests from tenants for deferments and forgiveness and is working with them on a case-by-case basis.

Member Silverstrom confirmed the County currently has an eviction moratorium in place through the end of August and urged those interested to contact DCBA@LACOUNTY.gov for both commercial and residential tenants.

City Attorney Webb added that the courts are handling limited matters, currently.

Member Ketchum discussed tenants who can afford to pay and are taking advantage of the moratorium not to, which is putting stress on landlords and noted the need to be careful in considering who will be impacted.

Member Semaan announced that those interested in pursuing sidewalk dining should email RedondoEngineering@redondo.org.

In reply to Member Witzansky's question regarding the latest projected mortality rate for COVID-19, Member Dr. Gausche-Hill reported it varies, significantly, by age and other factors.

Dr. Kim agreed it is not a simple answer as other factors include ethnicity, age and comorbidities.

Chair Brand noted meetings will be scheduled on an "as-needed" basis and thanked everyone for participating.

SUMMARY OF CITY EMERGENCY ORDERS AND UPDATED CIRCUMSTANCES SINCE THE DISASTER COUNCIL MEETING OF JULY 15, 2020

Summary of City Emergency Orders Pertaining to COVID-19

From the Proclamation of Emergency on March 12, 2020 to September 29, 2020 Items in **Bold** have been implemented since September 1, 2020

- Increased cleaning of restrooms and City Facilities utilized by the public, including deep cleaning and disinfecting of all high-touch areas, to inhibit the potential spread of the Covid-19/Corona Virus.
- Beginning March 13, 2020, the Anderson Park Senior Center, Perry Park Senior Center and Veterans Park Senior Center were closed until further notice. No classes, programs or operations will be held. The Senior Centers have been closed until further notice.
- Beginning March 13, 2020, Senior Excursions for the months of March and April, 2020 were cancelled. The cancellation has been extended indefinitely.
- From March 13, 2020 through June 30, 2020, all special events in the City and those at the Redondo Beach Performing Arts Center (RBPAC) for which the total occupancy exceeds 250 persons were cancelled. The cancellation was further expanded to include events of 50 or more and now includes full closure of the RBPAC for the period March 17, 2020 through March 31, 2020. Similarly, the BeachLife Festival has been ordered postponed. Activities at RBPAC were cancelled through May 31, 2020. All Citywide Special Events were cancelled through May 31, 2020. These cancellations were extended through June 30, 2020. The cancellation of citywide Special Events was extended until further notice. The cancellation of Citywide Special Events was extended until further notice.
- All Recreation Spring Break Camps have been cancelled.
- Dissemination of best practices related to social distancing and good hygiene on the City website and other pertinent information for the prevention of community spread of COVID-19.
- Ordering the limiting of employee work-related travel.
- Preparing contingency plans for continuity of government in the event City employees contract COVID-19.
- Beginning March 15, 2020 Redondo Beach Libraries, both the Main and North Branch, and all associated programs and meetings were closed to the public until April 13, 2020. The timing of the closure is in parallel with the closure schedule announced by the Redondo Unified School District for Redondo Beach Public Schools and may be extended as necessary. These closures were extended through May 15, 2020. The closures were extended through June 30, 2020 unless appropriate infection control measures can be implemented consistent with Los

Angeles County guidelines to allow for curbside library material pick-up. The Library Department initiated the "Takeout" program on July 1, 2020, which allows patrons to pick up materials that have been placed on hold via telephone or through the online reservation system. The closure of the Main and North Branch Libraries was extended through July 31, 2020. The closure of the Main and North Branch Libraries was extended until further notice.

- Beginning March 15, 2020, the Riviera Village Sunday Farmers Market and the Veteran's Park Thursday Farmers Market have been cancelled until April 30, 2020. This cancellation has been extended through May 31, 2020 unless an operating plan can be implemented for each site that meets current LA County Health Officer Order requirements for Farmers Market Operations.
- The Perry Park Teen Center was closed beginning March 16, 2020 through April 13, 2020. No classes, programs or operations will be held. This closure was extended through May 15, 2020. This closure was extended through June 30, 2020. This closure has been extended until further notice.
- All recreation after-school program operations and after-care activities were cancelled beginning March 16, 2020 through April 13, 2020. This closure was extended to August 19, 2020, per the RBUSD school year calendar. The cancellation of recreation after-school program operations and after-care activities was extended until further notice.
- Beginning March 17, 2020 all Redondo Beach City Offices and counters including those at City Hall, the Public Works Yard, Community Services Office, Police Department, and Fire Department were closed to the public. This closure has been extended until further notice.
- City Management and Department Directors are working to install alternative systems and procedures to temporarily transition core municipal services and enable public access via telephone, e-mail, or other web-based technology. Limited Plan Check services have been made available on an appointment basis via the Community Development Department. Updated information will be provided on the respective City Departmental web pages.
- The Redondo Beach Police and Fire Departments will continue to respond to calls for service and have incorporated response protocols to safeguard employees and the public to reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19. Fire Inspection services for residential and commercial buildings have been suspended until further notice. Fire Inspection services are expected to resume on August 24, 2020.
- The Redondo Beach Public Works Department and City contractors will continue to perform maintenance and repair work within the City – e.g. street repair and park maintenance.

- Street sweeping parking enforcement has been suspended until further notice.
 This Order has been rescinded. Street sweeping parking enforcement resumed on September 21, 2020.
- Meetings of the following Advisory Commissions have been suspended until April 30, 2020:
 - Budget and Finance Commission
 - Harbor Commission
 - Historical Commission
 - Library Commission
 - Preservation Commission
 - Public Art Commission
 - Public Safety Commission
 - Public Works Commission
 - Recreation and Parks Commission
 - Suspension Appeals Board
 - Youth Commission

The suspension was extended through May 31, 2020 except for the Harbor Commission and Budget and Finance Commission. The suspension was extended through June 30, 2020 except for the Harbor and Budget and Finance commissions. The suspension has been extended through August 31, 2020 for all commissions except the Planning, Harbor, and Budget and Finance commissions.

- The City's Information Technology Department has been exploring how meetings
 of the City Council and the Planning Commission can be made accessible to the
 public and to elected/appointed officials via web or teleconferencing.
- On March 17, 2020 and March 19, 2020 respectively, the following methods of public participation were made available prior to and during the City Council and Planning Commission Meetings:
 - Via E-Mail in Advance of the Meeting -- Submit e-mail comments to the City Clerk (cityclerk@redondo.org) by 3:00 p.m. on the day of the meeting. Submittals after this time will not be duplicated and provided to members in advance of the meeting.
 - 2. In Person at the Meeting The City Council Chambers will be reconfigured to ensure social distancing among members of the public and participating City Council/Planning Commission members. Space will be limited for in person participation. Seniors and individuals with underlying chronic conditions or those who are ill are encouraged to use alternate methods to provide public comment.
 - Via Telephone During the Meeting

- Beginning March 31, 2020, and consistent with the Governor's temporary modifications to California public meeting requirements under the Brown Act, no in-person attendance will be allowed at City Council and Planning Commission Meetings. Opportunities for public participation have been revised to include the following:
 - Via E-Mail in Advance of the Meeting -- Submit e-mail comments to the City Clerk (cityclerk@redondo.org) by 3:00 p.m. on the day of the meeting.
 - Via Webinar Members of the public can participate in the Zoom Meeting via real-time e-comments for specific agenda items. Meeting format is subject to change.

Beginning on July 16, 2020 the City Council and Commission Meeting format was expanded to include public comment via pre-registered zoom video and audio item by item participation.

- For the period March 17, 2020 through March 31, 2020 all gatherings of 50 individuals or more are prohibited. All gatherings not prohibited must follow Los Angeles County Health recommendations such as social distancing and access to hand washing facilities. This Order was revised to prohibit all indoor and outdoor public and private gatherings and events through April 24, 2020. This Order was extended through May 15, 2020. This Order has been rescinded and replaced by the Order issued by Los Angeles County.
- For the period March 17, 2020 through March 31, 2020 all restaurants in Redondo Beach must close their dining rooms to the public and limit their services to only preparing and offering food to customers via delivery service, via pick up for takeout dining only, or via drive thru (further described in the March 16, 2020 City Manager Order). This Order was extended through May 15, 2020. This Order has been rescinded and replaced by the Order issued by the County of Los Angeles.
- For the period March 17, 2020 through March 31, 2020, Bars and Nightclubs that
 do not serve food, Gyms, Fitness Centers, Movie Theatres, Live performance
 Theaters, Bowling Alleys and Arcades have been closed (further described in the
 March 16, 2020 City Manager Order). This Order was extended through May 15,
 2020. This Order has been rescinded and replaced by the Order issued by the
 County of Los Angeles.
- For the period March 16, 2020 through June 16, 2020, utility shut offs and late penalties for the non-payment of utility bills and late payment penalties for parking violations are prohibited (further described in the March 16, 2020 City Manager City Order).
- Beginning March 16, 2020, for the duration of the Emergency Period, a temporary moratorium on evictions has been implemented for the non-payment of rent or mortgage payments by residential and commercial tenants/occupants impacted by

the COVID-19 crisis (further described in the attached March 16, 2020 City Manager Order). The Order grants a defense in the event that an unlawful detainer action is commenced in violation of the Order. The duration of the Emergency Period is unknown at this time and will be determined when the City Manager, in his capacity as Emergency Services Director, declares its end and the City Council ratifies his action. The Los Angeles County Emergency Order currently runs through April 19, 2020. The County Order was extended through May 15, 2020. This Order is superseded by the Order issued by the State of California and has been rescinded by the City.

- Beginning March 20, 2020, operational changes were made to the Beach Cities
 Transit system and the Wave dial-a-ride program. This Order was extended
 through May 15, 2020. This Order was extended through June 30, 2020.
- For the period March 20, 2020 through April 24, 2020, City Park Playgrounds are closed to the public. This Order was extended through May 15, 2020. This Order has been extended through June 30, 2020. This order is rescinded effective the date when Los Angeles County reopens County Park Playgrounds.
- For the period March 20, 2020 through April 24, 2020, Wilderness Park is closed to the public. This Order was extended through May 15, 2020. This Order has been extended through May 31, 2020.
- Per the City Manager's March 26, 2020 Emergency Order, beginning March 27, 2020 at 12:00 AM through April 24, 2020 (now through June 30, 2020 for items 16 and 19 below only all other facilities have been reopened) at 12:00 AM, the following City spaces, parks and facilities are closed to the public:
 - The Redondo Beach Pier, International Boardwalk and Parking Structures, except at designated locations for the purpose of picking up food at restaurants providing to-go orders and employees of those restaurants still providing service. The exception is also extended to employees of any commercial businesses at the Pier that are considered Essential Businesses under California and Los Angeles County COVID-19 Emergency Orders and any deliveries to those businesses. These orders have been rescinded.
 - 2. The Esplanade, as defined as the sidewalk and parking spaces along the west side of the street from the City's southern boundary with the City of Torrance at Calle Miramar to Knob Hill Avenue, and the Parking Lot adjacent to Miramar Park in Torrance. The Esplanade sidewalk has been reopened. The parking spaces along the west side of the street and the Parking Lot adjacent to Miramar Park reopened on May 26, 2020, however, the parking spaces along the west side of the Esplanade and the Parking Lot adjacent to Miramar Park in Torrance were closed for the period July 3, 2020 at 12:01 AM through July 6, 2020 at 5:00 AM.
 - Veteran's Park and Parking Lots, including the public parking areas adjacent to the Elks Lodge. These orders were rescinded, however for the

- period July 3, 2020 at 12:01 AM through July 6, 2020 at 5:00 AM, Veteran's Park and Parking Lots, including the public parking areas adjacent to the Elks Lodge, were closed to the public.
- 4. All public walkways, stairways, ramps, and paths that provide access to the Beach. These beach access points reopened, except for the stairs at Avenue C, concurrently with Los Angeles County's reopening of the Beach for exercise and ocean water activities on May 13, 2020. This order has been rescinded.
- The coastal bluff trail between Knob Hill Avenue and George Freeth Way.
 This order has been rescinded.
- The Pedestrian Path adjacent to the Los Angeles County Beach Bike Path between the City's southern boundary and the Redondo Beach Pier. This order has been rescinded.
- All walkways and stairways that provide access from private residential properties to the Redondo Beach Pier and International Boardwalk. These orders have been rescinded.
- 8. George Freeth Way, including the street, sidewalk and parking. This order has been rescinded, however for the period July 3, 2020 at 12:01 AM through July 6, 2020 at 5:00 AM, George Freeth Way, including the street and parking spaces, but not including the sidewalk, was closed to the public.
- Czuleger Park, except for the purpose of ingress and egress to residential properties adjacent to the Park. Czulegar Park has been reopened.
- 10. Redondo Bike Path Parkette and Parking Lot. This order has been rescinded, however for the period July 3, 2020 at 12:01 AM through July 6, 2020 at 5:00 AM, the Redondo Bike Path Parkette Parking Lot was closed to the public.
- 11. Moonstone Park. This order has been rescinded.
- 12. The Sidewalk, Bike Path, and Public Parking on the west side of Harbor Drive. The Bike Path and Sidewalk on Harbor Drive have been reopened. This order has been rescinded.
- 13. The Personal Watercraft Hand Launching Facility and the access road behind Seaside Lagoon. The Personal Watercraft Hand Launching Facility will be reopened on May 15, 2020 with the implementation of social distancing and new operational requirements as determined by the Waterfront and Economic Development Department. This order has been rescinded.
- 14. The Public Boat Hoist located in the Redondo Beach Marina. The Boat Hoist will be reopened on May 15, 2020 with the implementation of social distancing and new operational requirements as determined by the Waterfront and Economic Development Department. This order has been rescinded.
- 15. The Redondo Beach Marina Parking Lot, except at designated locations for the purpose of picking up food from restaurants providing to-go orders and employees of those restaurants still providing service. The exception is also extended to employees of any commercial businesses at the Pier that are considered Essential Businesses under California and Los Angeles County

- COVID-19 Emergency Orders and any deliveries to those businesses. The exception will be extended to Boat Hoist and Personal Watercraft Hand Launch Facility users effective May 15, 2020. This order has been rescinded.
- Aviation Park. This order is rescinded effective the date when Los Angeles County reopens County Sports Fields.
- 17. The North Redondo Beach Bike Path from Robinson Street to Felton Lane. The North Redondo Beach Bike Path has been reopened, with the exception of the portions of the Path near Artesia Blvd. that are impacted by construction. This order has been rescinded.
- 18. The Dog Park at Dominguez Park. The Dog Park was reopened on May 9, 2020 with the implementation of social distancing, face covering, and new operational requirements as determined by the Recreation and Community Services Department. This order has been rescinded.
- 19. City Park Basketball Courts. This order is rescinded effective the date when Los Angeles County reopens County Basketball Courts.
- 20. City Park Tennis Courts. Tennis Courts will be reopened concurrently with Los Angeles County's reopening of tennis court facilities with new social distancing requirements as determined by the Recreation and Community Services Department. This order has been rescinded.

This Order was extended through May 15, 2020. Except for the items modified above, this Order has been extended through June 30, 2020. If Los Angeles County re-opens its beaches for leisure activities and its coastal bike path before June 30, 2020, Order Numbers 1-12 and 15 above are rescinded as of the date of County beach leisure activity and bike-path re-opening. Given the recent efforts by State and County Officials to help accelerate the re-opening of businesses, public amenities, and commercial services throughout the region, orders 1-15, 17,18 and 20 above have been rescinded and all of the facilities described in the sections above have been reopened subject to ongoing County Health Order restrictions. Orders #16 - Aviation Park and #19 - City Park Basketball Courts remain in place until Los Angeles County reopens County Basketball Courts and Sports Fields respectively. Although not part of the City Manager's June 30, 2020 Order, it should be noted that Los Angeles County, on June 29, 2020, issued an Order temporarily closing Public Beaches, Piers, Beach Bike Paths, and Beach Access Points for the period July 3 through 6 and prohibited Fireworks Shows and Events until further notice. The County's Pier closure only pertained to the portions of the Redondo Beach Pier used for fishing or ocean observation and does not include the Pier's restaurant and retail zones.

- For the period March 28, 2020 through April 24, 2020, the baseball fields at Dominguez, Alta Vista and Perry Parks are closed to the public. This Order was extended through May 15, 2020. This Order has been extended through June 30, 2020. This order is rescinded effective the date when Los Angeles County reopens County Sports Fields.
- Further described in the City Manager's April 9, 2020 Emergency Order (which is attached), for the period April 10, 2020 at 12:00 AM through April 24, 2020 at 12:00

AM, workers and customers of certain businesses and essential service providers such as grocery stores, laundromats, restaurants, and hotels must wear face coverings while performing their work, visiting the businesses or receiving the service. This Order was extended through May 15, 2020. This Order was extended through June 30, 2020. State and County Face Covering Orders remain in effect.

- The opening of Seaside Lagoon, scheduled for May 23, 2020, has been postponed indefinitely. Reservations for facility rentals at Seaside Lagoon have also been postponed indefinitely.
- City application fees for Temporary Use Permits needed for outdoor business activities on private commercial property during the COVID-19 Local Emergency Period were waived beginning June 9, 2020.
- City application fees for Encroachment Permits for Sidewalk Dining and Park Use Permits for Redondo Beach based businesses using City Parks for outdoor fitness, health, and wellness activities during the COVID-19 Local Emergency Period were waived beginning August 4, 2020.

RESOLUTION NO. CC-2008-058

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDONDO BEACH CALIFORNIA RECOMMENDING INDIVIDUALS WEAR FACE COVERINGS WHEN IN PUBLIC WITH CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS

WHEREAS, international, national, state, and local health and governmental authorities are responding to the threat of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8634 empowers the City Council and delegated officials to promulgate orders and regulations necessary to provide for protection of life or property during a local emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has specifically delegated this authority to the City Manager as Director of Emergency Services in Chapter 2 of Title 3 of the Redondo Beach Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, the City Manager acting as the Director of Emergency Services issued a proclamation declaring a local emergency due to the imminent threat of COVID-19 in Redondo Beach and subsequently issued a number of emergency orders to help protect residents, visitors and City employees and to combat the spread of the virus in the community on March 16th, March 20th, March 26th, April 9th, May 7th, May 29th; June 30th and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council ratified the declaration of local emergency and confirmed all emergency orders issued and implemented by the City Manager acting as the Director of Emergency Services on March 17th, March 31st, April 21st, May 12th with some modifications, May 29th and July 7th; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Los Angeles County Public Health Officer issued the Safer at Home Order; which has been amended and superseded by Safer at Home Orders on March 21st, March 27th, March 31st, April 10th and later by the Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 orders; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020 the Governor of the State of California issued Executive Order N-33-20 ordering all individuals living in the State of California to stay home or at their place of residence; and

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2020, the Governor of the State of California issued Executive Order N-60-20 which informed local health jurisdictions and industry sectors

that they may gradually reopen under new modifications and guidance provided by the State Public Health Officer; and

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2020, the State Public Health Officer outlined a phased approach to reopening California as set forth in California's Pandemic Resilience Roadmap, which identified four stages of the pandemic as follows: safety and preparation (Stage 1), reopening of lower-risk workplaces and other spaces (Stage 2), reopening of higher-risk workplaces and other spaces (Stage 3), and finally an easing of final restrictions leading to the end of the stay at home order (Stage 4);

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2020 the State Public Health Officer acknowledged that COVID-19 still posed a significant risk to the health of individuals in California but also determined that the statewide data supported a gradual movement of the entire state from Stage 1 to Stage 2 of California's Pandemic Resilience Roadmap and therefore, issued an order which allowed all local health jurisdictions to begin gradual movement into Stage 2 effective May 8, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the County of Los Angeles Public Health Officer issued Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 orders (COVID-19 order(s)), the latest dated July 18, 2020, to align with the State Executive Orders and State Health Officer Orders that support the phased reopening of California consistent with the California Pandemic Resilience Roadmap which allows for the conditional reopening of activities, business sectors and establishments with modifications at a pace designed to protect health and safety and to lower the risk of COVID-19 transmission and outbreaks in the community; and

WHEREAS, with the recent regressions of COVID-19 Indicators, within the County of Los Angeles which showed troubling and substantial increases in the new daily reported COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and testing positivity rate, the July 18, 2020 Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 order required the immediate temporary closure of specific activities and business sectors which aligned with the July 13, 2020 announcement by the Governor regarding the closure of specific activities and business sectors and the State Public Health Officer's phased reopening approach; and

WHEREAS, since June 19, 2020, the County COVID-19 orders requires all persons wear a cloth face covering over both the nose and mouth whenever they leave their place of residence and are or can be in contact with or walking near or past others who are non-household members in both public and private places, whether indoors or outdoors, including when patronizing a business; and

WHEREAS, the County COVID-19 orders have stated that wearing a cloth face covering reduces the risk of transmission to other from people who do not have symptoms and do not know they are infected; and

WHEREAS, the "Guidance for Cloth Face Coverings" issued by Los Angeles County Department of Public Health identifies several groups should not wear a face covering, including but not limited to children under the age of 2 and anyone instructed not to wear a cloth face covering by a medical provider; and

WHEREAS, despite the Face Covering Requirement, many persons are failing to wear a face covering, which increases the risk of COVID-19 transmission to others in the community; and

WHEREAS, as of July 29, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) website listed the number of COVID-19 cases in the United States of America at 4,339,997 persons, including 148,866 deaths in the Country, and the Los Angeles County Public Health Department cited 178,642 cases (376 in Redondo Beach) and 4,426 deaths in Los Angeles County; and

WHEREAS, a growing number of scientific studies support that masks are a critical tool in curbing the spread of the coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redondo Beach would like to strongly recommend that individuals who live, work and visit the City of Redondo Beach wear face coverings to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDONDO BEACH, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Order by reference.

SECTION 2. It is strongly recommended that all persons wear a cloth face covering over both the nose and mouth whenever they leave their place of residence, except for:

- A. Persons younger than two years old;
- B. Those instructed not to wear a cloth face covering by a medical provider.
- C. Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.

- D. Persons for whom wearing a face covering would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidelines.
- E. Persons who are obtaining a service involving the nose or face for which temporary removal of the face covering is necessary to perform the service.
- F. Persons who are engaged in outdoor work or recreation such as swimming, walking, hiking, bicycling, or running, when alone or with household members, and when they are able to maintain a distance of at least six feet from others.

It is recommended that persons who are seated at a restaurant or other establishment that offers food or beverage service wear a cloth face covering over both the nose and mouth, unless they are eating or drinking.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and shall enter the same in the Book of Original Resolutions.
